Alumni on Point: Alice Villadolid

Alice Colet Villadolid graduated summa cum laude with a degree in AB Journalism. She also obtained her post-graduate degrees in social science and journalism in from the UST Graduate School, Press Foundation of Asia, and the International Institute of Journalism in Berlin. She is a recipient of The Outstanding Thomasian Alumni award in 2005.

Her road to prominence in the world of Journalism started way back 1952 where she served as a reporter and copy editor for the Manila Chronicles. She also wrote for UNICEF News, Weekly Nation, Mr. And Ms. Woman and Home, and Oil Progress. In 1971, she became the Philippine correspondent for international news outlets, New York Times and Newsweek.


She was awarded with a Human Rights Award by the Concerned Women of the Philippines as recognition for her achievements in responsible journalism. She was also a recipient of Roster of EDSA Heroes Award. She also held positions in various Journalism organizations like the Philippine Press Institute where she acted as Executive Director and as a Board Trustee. She was the Vice-President of the Asian Institute of Journalism and Communication, Ombudsperson for the Philippine Daily Inquirer, and Commissioner for Cultural Dissemination of the National Commissioner for Culture and Arts.

In 2000, Villadolid received the Outstanding Catholic Author Award from the Asian Catholic Publishers Inc. for her service as the Consort of the Philippine Ambassador to the Holy See from 1991-1995.

At present, Villadolid teaches at the Graduate School of the University.

While some employers look at the credentials of the applicants, some choose to see the potential even if the applicant did not graduate in the field they were applying to.

The job fair was visited not only by the graduating students and alumni, but also the juniors who are seeking internship or On-the-Job Training programs offered by the companies.

Francis Tiro, an incoming fourth year Communication Arts major, took the advantage of showing interest of having his internship in one of the media companies invited by UST.

Incoming 4th year Human Resource Development Management student, Joanne Claire Tan sees the job fair as a sneak peek of what she will be doing in the future.

"As a student, this was an essential experience for my continuous learning as I will have my internship soon," Joanne said. "And it also made me realize that in the future, if I continue to pursue and work in this field, I will be the one accepting resumés from others."

Apart from the job opportunities, gifts from company exhibitors like Robinson's Bank, Eastwest Bank, Inspira, British United, Automibile Inc., Factset, Walker, and Sunwalk Inc. were given away to the participants of the job fair through a raffle draw.
